# Club Play

The NHTTC has open club play every Sunday night from 6PM until 9PM. All ages and skill levels are welcome.

Participants take turns playing matches against each other. Some players prefer doubles matches. Participants have their choice of either single or doubles play. At the end of a match, waiting players rotate in to play the winner.

The NHTTC uses the USATT rules. This includes the use of 40mm balls and red/black paddles. Matches between participants are normally best of 5 games to 11 points.

## Directions

The NHTTC plays in the gym at the Manchester Boys Club. It is located at 555 Union Street in Manchester New Hampshire.

### FROM I-93 NORTH OR SOUTH:

- Take Exit 8 (Bridge St)
- Proceed on Bridge Street toward downtown Manchester.
- Take a left onto Union Street (Union is three blocks east of Elm Street).

The Boys & Girls Club will be on your left one block south of Bridge Street.

### FROM I-293 NORTH

- Take Exit 5 (Granite Street).
- Turn right at bottom of ramp.
- Take a left at the third set of lights onto Elm Street.
- Proceed north until intersection of Elm and Bridge Street, and take a right onto Bridge Street.
- Take a right three blocks east of Elm Street onto Union Street.

The Boys & Girls Club will be on your left one block south of Bridge Street.

The gym is on the left side of the building when you are facing the Boys & Girls club main entrance. Entry to the club is through the gym door to the left of the main entrance.
