Club Play

The NHTTC has open club play every Sunday night from 5PM until 9PM. All ages and skill levels are welcome.

Participants take turns playing matches against each other. Some players prefer doubles matches. Participants have their choice of either single or doubles play. At the end of a match, waiting players rotate in to play the winner.

The NHTTC uses the new USATT rules. This includes the use of 40mm balls. Matches between participants are normally best of either 5 or 7 games to 11 points.

Directions

The NHTTC plays in the large gym of the Boys & Girls Club. It is located at 555 Union St in Manchester New Hampshire.

FROM I-93 NORTH OR SOUTH:

- Take Exit 8 (Bridge St)
- Proceed on Bridge St West toward downtown Manchester.
- Take a left onto Union St. Union is three blocks east of Elm St.

The Boys & Girls Club will be on your left one block south of Bridge St.

FROM I-293 NORTH

- Take Exit 5 (Granite St.)
- Turn right at bottom of ramp.
- Take a left at the third set of lights onto Elm St.
- Proceed north until intersection of Elm and Bridge St, and take a right onto Bridge St.
- Take a right three blocks east of Elm St onto Union St.

The Boys & Girls Club will be on your left one block south of Bridge St.

The gym is on the left side of the building when you are facing the Boys & Girls club main entrance. Entry to the club is through the gym door to the left of the main entrance.
